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Phase 2 Construction

As you all can attest to by the dozens of construction crews scrambling through the building, Phase 2 of the Merc construction is nearing it's end. Here is an update of the progress being made to finish the project.

Atrium and grand stair near completion

Phase 2 construction is nearing an end! The historic atrium skylight has been fabricated and was hoisted into place in late November. The atrium was transformed onto a completely different space when the light spilled in from above. Soon after, the floors on the second and third level were opened up in the octagonal shape that was part of the original design of the building. The plaster relief that surrounds the soffit of the skylight was reproduced using rubber molds cast from the original motif. Plaster was then poured and new sections, resembling puzzle pieces, were cast and installed. The soft gold color scheme of the plasterwork is compatible with the historic,

patterned carpet which will be in shades of terra cotta, gold, blue and sage green and will be laid in the common spaces. The original metal railing is now being installed and the grand staircase in the atrium puts the finishing touch on a truly spectacular space. As you stand on the ground floor and look all the way up to the rooftop skylight, you can't help but imagine what this space was like in it's heyday. Only a few Hamiltonians might remember what a breathtaking atrium we are recreating inside the Historic Mercantile Lofts, but we are getting closer every day to revealing this crown jewel to the public.

Apartments available in early 2012

Twenty more loft apartments will be available in early 2012. There is already great interest from young professionals as well as "empty nesters" in what The Merc has to offer. Phase 2 includes small one bedroom units at 660 sq ft and large one bedrooms in the 725-850 sq ft range. There are even two one bedroom lofts that are 1,250 sq ft! Two bedroom apartments are offered from 770 sq ft all the way up to 1,400 sq ft. As in Phase 1, each loft apartment has a unique layout and no two are alike, but each has all the architectural features that the footprint of our historic building has to offer.

The long awaited elevator will soon be operational! It will be accessible from the atrium when the occupancy permit is granted. Will we miss carrying those groceries up the stairs? No! This winter, Jason's crew will be working hard to complete the rest of the project. Thanks to all our tenants for your patience during this process - we appreciate it!
